Ronald B. Johnson, 69, of Hebron died Sunday, January 15, 2012 at Centegra Hospital Medical Center, Woodstock.

Ronald was born in Harvard on December 6, 1942, the son of the late Clarence and Lucille (Cepek) Johnson.

He owned and operated the Bake House Restaurant in Hebron for 26 years, where he was the proud host of Accordion Night every Tuesday. He was an industrial contractor, owning MGM Industrial Contractors, covering much of the U.S., for over 25 years. He was a trustee of the Village of Hebron and served on the planning commission.

He served in the U.S. Marines from December 1959 to December 1963 during the Vietnam War.
