Donald J. Grons, 77, of Spring Grove, IL passed away Thursday, January 9, 2020 at Northwestern McHenry Hospital, McHenry, IL.

“ I had the pleasure of meeting this most remarkable man June of 1994 when he interviewed me for a position with Oracle. On 4 July, 1994, Don called me to offer me the position of instructor with his amazing manufacturing group. That was the beginning of a cherished relationship with this kind man of God who was the best manager I have ever had in my entire professional career.

During the time we were working to create a product for Oracle, he was there to listen to me gripe, stomp my feet, and even occasionally almost cry because I was so frustrated with the process. He was my anchor, my sounding board, the voice of sanity and helped me calm down and even made me laugh. After greeting me on the phone, he started our real conversation with "Now, Vera" and proceeded to give me bad news. But the amazing thing was that I was more concerned with Don having to give me the news, than the actual news itself. You could tell he just hated to be the bearer of any bad news. Don's team of 'dirty dozen' was a force to be reckon with and all the other instructors wanted to be part of his 'work hard, play hard' team. He even rented a convertible once and let us all climb aboard for a ride around the parking lot -- having the time of our lives with him at the wheel.

When Don retired, over 40 people came to Chicago to surprise him at Wrigley field and then at a party hosted in his honor. That's the kind of man he was - he inspired all of us and we never forgot him.

His face would just light up when he talked of his beautiful wife, Kathy, his kids and grand kids. They meant the world to him and we would always ask to see pictures.

My heart is breaking and the light in this world is dimmer at his passing. I believe God sends people to us for a reason. I believe God sent Don to me as an example of a man who was strong in his christian belief and he exemplified it every day with all he met. I thank God for this blessing and ask Him to give strength, comfort and courage to his wife Kathy and his family.
