Kathryn Dickerson, age 82, of Hebron, passed away Thursday June 25, 2020 at Aurora Lakeland Medical Center in Elkhorn, WI.

She was a lifelong resident of Hebron, IL, and graduated from Alden Hebron High School in the class of 1955.

She is survived by several cousins, her church family and friends and her dog, Winky, who misses her dearly. She was preceded by four Pomeranian (Winky) dogs who were her faithful companions.
