Mervin A. Huff, 85, of Richmond, died Thursday, May 19, 2011 at Lakeland Health Care Center in Elkhorn, WI.

Mervin was born on the family farm October 27, 1925 in Spring Grove, the son of the late George and Anna (Freund) Huff. He worked on the farm with his father and brother until entering the U.S. Army in Feb. 1954. He was a Spec 4 with the equipment engineers in Newfoundland until his discharge in Dec. 1955.

He was married to Shirley Austin on May 25, 1974 in Ringwood and she died February 28, 2009.

He was a concrete mason for Arnold May in Richmond and Laursen & Blackman Concrete in Antioch and finished his career with Stan's Lumber in Twin Lakes.
